A visual history of the Bröntes on screen, looking at adaptations of their novels, depictions of their lives and times, and the influence they've had on cinema Farewell to Thee is a new installation by internationally acclaimed artist Bill Balaskas, inspired by a nuclear alert that was mistakenly issued in the US state of Hawaii on 13 January 2018.

The ballistic missile alert warning residents that a nuclear strike was imminent was communicated through mobile phone messages and compelled people to take immediate shelter from the looming nuclear catastrophe.

38 minutes later, Hawaiians received notification that the earlier alert was a false alarm. The incident sparked international headlines at a time when nuclear tensions were at a peak.

Balaskas uses this incident to reflect on the relationship between new media, spectacle and contemporary politics. Combining a variety of visual references, the artist highlights the absurdity of today's world, in which the prospect of nuclear war has emphatically returned to people's everyday lives.

Farewell to Thee* is a poignant reflection on the grave contradictions of this world, in which information and knowledge are supposedly more widely available than ever, yet old "irrational" threats not only persist, but grow stronger.




