While friends and family move to Pakistan, rejecting an increasingly hostile India, Salim must decide whether to abandon his home and personal history or remain in a country that threatens to pull his life apart.

Exploited by the society that surrounds her and taken for granted by her own family, Nita is forced to bear the consequences of political upheaval.


