When high school pupil and literature club president Itsumi plunges to her death from the school roof, rumours soon begin to spread that one of the club's members is the killer. Itsumi's friend - and the club's new chairman -Sumikawa gathers the club together and asks each member to explain where they were at the time of Itsumi's death. But who is telling the truth and who's got something to hide? And what really did happen to Itsumi?

When the ninia council takes on the Nobunaga warlords Mumon joins the fight, leading the Iga family to battle with a secret plan and some of the most cunning tactics imaginable. Director Yoshihiro Nakamura (Fish Story, Golden Slumber) brings his signature offbeat style to this *jidaigeki* (period drama) epic, with a jazzy soundtrack and fantastic action sequences.

Reiji Kikukawa (Ikuta) is an inept rookie cop with a strong sense of justice. Fired for trying to arrest a city councillor caught molesting a teenage girl, he is secretly re-hired as an undercover agent and sent on a mission to infiltrate a notorious Yakuza clan.

Potter Yumiko enquires about a room for rent in an Osaka mansion, and finds a bizarre collection of characters already living there including a panty-stealing gangster, a woman selling illicit liquor, and an antique dealer who can't sexually satisfy his wife so he traps men in his room for her. Head of the group is Yoda Goro, an eccentric yet naive jack-of-all-trades who is susceptible to manipulation. Little known outside of Japan, Kawashima's film is a satirical masterpiece.

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



Still living in Paul's childhood home and seeking to make a change to both their own lives and the wider world, they elect to go through 'downsizing' – a procedure designed to conserve resources by shrinking people. But will the grass actually be greener in the downsized world? Playing down the more outlandish elements inherent in his premise, Payne presents an astute critique of excess and consumerism in the modern world.

★★★★ – The Guardian Guillermo del Toro (*Pan's Labyrinth*) delivers a Golden Globe-winning love-letter to the monster movie with this otherworldly fable set against the backdrop of Cold War America. In the government laboratory where she works, Elisa's (Hawkins) life is changed forever when she discovers a secret classified experiment – an aquatic creature kept hidden in the basement. Unable to speak herself, Elisa teaches the creature to



communicate via sign language and the pair eventually fall in love. But can love transcend society's boundaries? Del Toro's eye for beauty in the macabre is as strong as ever, yet *The Shape of Water* is at its heart a moving and tender love story.

The BFI National Archive team have outdone themselves with their glorious restoration of *Shiraz*, the sumptuous silent retelling of the story of the 17th century princess who inspired construction of the Taj Mahal. Shiraz is a potter's son, brought up as a brother to Selima. When Selima is kidnapped by and sold as a slave to Prince Khurram, Shiraz follows her, risking a horrible death to protect her and one day design her great memorial. Eager new World War I recruit Lieutenant Raleigh (Butterfield) has pulled strings to join his friend Captain Stanhope (Claflin) on the frontline. But when Raleigh arrives in the trenches he finds that Stanhope – now damaged and disturbed by the war – is no longer the childhood hero he remembers.

Changing Places is an exhibition of artists' video curated by Film and Video Umbrella, linking the industrial transformations occurring across South Asia with sites of historic significance in Britain.

ART

Places are constantly on the move, regularly being transformed, reinhabited or reinvented. *Changing Places* highlights one of the biggest catalysts for change in modern times – industrialisation.

Sitting at the heart of the postindustrial St George's area of Leicester, we host three artworks by Imran Channa, Desire Machine Collective and Yasmin Jahan Nupur.



These artists all live in, work in, or retain a connection to Bangladesh, India or Pakistan.

The content of the works – and their placement in Leicester – highlights a shared history between England and South Asia, focusing on the international changes that are happening as a result of industrialisation.


