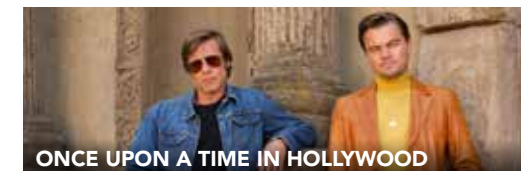
And our Stage on Screen summer season is in full swing, with world-class shows from Glyndebourne Opera, Stage Russia, the RSC, and NT Live (p16).

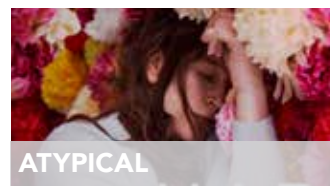

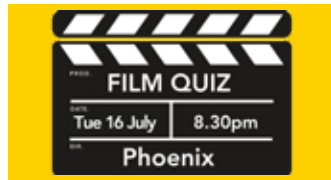

Though both women were married, they plunged into a passionate affair that would change their lives and inspire the writing of one of Woolf's most famous novels – *Orlando*. Vividly exploring the brilliant, troubled mind of one of history's most enduring literary figures, this period

drama feels refreshingly modern. Elizabeth Debrick is riveting as an anxious, restless Virginia Woolf in this seductive adaptation of Eileen Atkins' 1992 play.

With a top-notch A-list cast and smirkingly-played pop culture caricatures – including teenage zombies murmuring for "wifi" – *The Dead Don't Die* casts a sardonic, satirical eye on the zombie genre, and on modern life to boot.

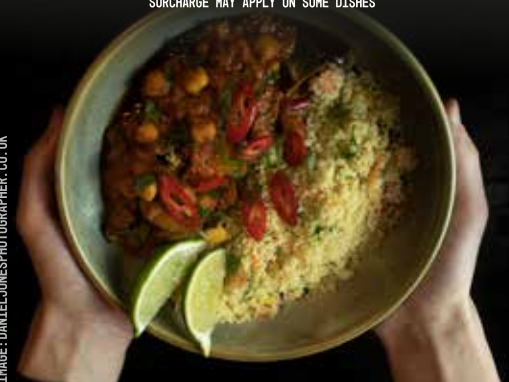

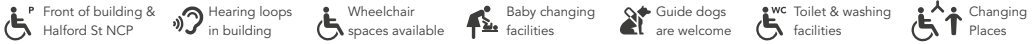

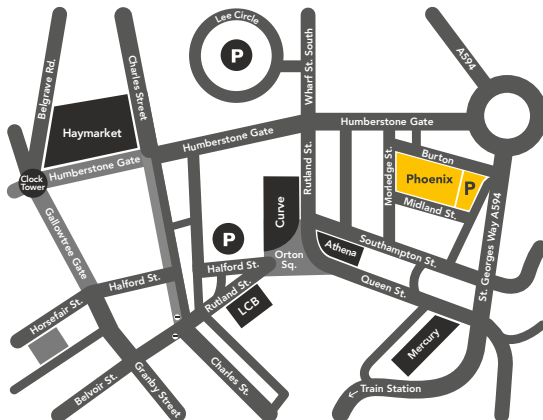
