#### **PETITE MAMAN (U) | Fri 3 – Thu 9 Dec, subtitles**

“★★★★★ – will pierce your heart, broaden your mind and gladden your soul” – Observer. After a bereavement, eight-year-old Nelly’s mother, Marion, disappears one night; but then Nelly meets a curiously familiar young girl, also named Marion. Céline Sciamma’s (**Portrait of a Lady on Fire**) latest is a perfectly crafted, moving and joyful film about loss and love.

#### **A BOY CALLED CHRISTMAS (CERT TBC) | Fri 3 – Sun 5 Dec**

This new film based on Matt Haig’s bestselling book is certain to become a Christmas classic. Nikolas, an ordinary young boy, sets out on an extraordinary adventure into the snowy north in search of his father.

#### **THE HAND OF GOD (CERT TBC) | Fri 3 – Thu 9 Dec, subtitles**

Paolo Sorrentino’s (**The Great Beauty, Il Divo**) deeply personal, autobiographical coming-of-age story is set in the hometown of his youth – 1980s Naples. Young Fabietto (Filippo Scotti) experiences the unexpected arrival of football legend Maradona and an equally unexpected tragedy. Subtitles.

#### **DRIVE MY CAR (15) | Fri 3 – Mon 6 Dec, subtitles**

“★★★★★ – profoundly beautiful” – Telegraph. Acclaimed Japanese filmmaker Ryusuke Hamaguchi (**Happy Hour**) directs this adaptation of Haruki Murakami’s short story from his “Men Without Women” collection.

#### **STAGE ON SCREEN: CHRISTMAS WITH ANDRÉ (PG) | Sat 4 Dec, 7.30pm & Wed 8 Dec, 7.30pm**

The King of the Waltz brings you a festive spectacular from his newly created Winter Palace in his hometown of Maastricht. Immerse yourself in the spirit of the season while singing and dancing away to lovely Christmas carols, romantic waltzes and beautiful melodies.

#### **EXHIBITION ON SCREEN: THE DANISH COLLECTOR (PG) | Sun 5 Dec, 4.30pm**

Exhibition on Screen tells the fascinating story of a visionary Danish collector of Impressionist art, with exclusive access to a sell-out exhibition at London’s Royal Academy, bringing an extraordinary collection to the big-screen in glorious high-definition.

#### **FRENCH FILM FESTIVAL UK: LINGUI, THE SACRED BONDS (18) | Mon 6 Dec, 6pm, subtitles**

Chadian director Mahamat-Saleh Haroun’s gorgeous, affecting drama centres on a single mother and her pregnant teen daughter as they seek an abortion in a country where it is technically legal but impossible to access.

#### **THE FRENCH DISPATCH (15) | Mon 6 – Thu 9 Dec**

“★★★★★ – one of Anderson’s very best” – The Times. Wes Anderson (**The Grand Budapest Hotel**) returns with his tenth film, assembling a cast of his usual suspects and a few new faces in this love letter to journalism, set in the final days of a magazine based in a fictional French town.

#### **JAPAN 2021: LONE WOLF AND CUB – SWORD OF VENGEANCE (18) | Tue 7 Dec, 8.30pm, subtitles**

A very rare screening of the first film in Kenji Misumi’s cult classic Lone Wolf and Cub film series. Legendary shogun executioner Ogami Ittō (Tomisaburo Wakayama) is framed for treason by the shadowy Yagyū clan.

#### **FRENCH FILM FESTIVAL UK: JOSEP (18) | Thu 9 Dec, 8.15pm, subtitles**

After fleeing the Spanish Civil War, republican cartoonist and exile Josep Bartolí was detained by the Gestapo and sent to various concentration camps. French illustrator Aurel’s stunning, hand-drawn biopic documents Bartolí’s time in Mexico, following his escape after jumping from a train that was taking him between camps.

#### **WINTER WARMERS: THE SHOP AROUND THE CORNER (PG) | Thu 9 Dec, 1pm & 6pm**

In the busy run-up to Christmas, a couple of ambitious sales staff are in competition with each other. But they’re also unwittingly in an anonymous romantic relationship, which until now has been conducted purely by letter. A delightful, festive comedy starring James Stewart (**It’s a Wonderful Life**) and Margaret Sullavan.
