



### FRI 19 – THU 25 AUG

#### **NOPE (15) | Fri 12 – Thu 25 Aug**

"★★★★★ – A film that does for open skies what Jaws did for the beach" – Telegraph. Jordan Peele (**Get Out, Us**) returns with a chilling sci-fi horror. Deep in a California valley, James (Daniel Kaluuya) and Jill (Keke Palmer) become caretakers of their father's ranch after he is killed by a mysterious object falling from the sky. As they probe into the cause of his death, they encounter forces seemingly from another planet.

#### **EIFFEL (15) | Fri 19 – Thu 25 Aug**

"A gorgeous French period romance" – MovieWeb. Romain Duris (**Populaire**) plays Gustave Eiffel in this romantic drama inspired by his life during the construction of his iconic tower. Having completed work on the Statue of Liberty, Gustave is at the peak of his career. A chance encounter with a wealthy heiress leads Gustave to create a spectacular centrepiece for the 1889 Exposition Universelle in Paris, changing the city's landscape forever. #### **FIRE OF LOVE (PG) | Fri 19 – Mon 22 Aug**

Sara Dosa's thrilling new film takes the daredevil documentary genre to new heights, chronicling the lives of French volcanologists Maurice and Katia Krafft, through their own awe-inspiring footage taken among the billowing smoke and trickling molten rock. Killed in a volcanic explosion in Japan in 1991, the fearless couple remain revered in the field, their 25 years of research shaping our understanding of volcanoes the world over.
